# What is ASE?

The National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence, or ASE, was established in 1972 as a non-profit organization to help improve the quality of automotive service and repair through the voluntary testing and certification of automotive technicians and parts specialists. Today, there are more than a

quarter of a million ASE Certified professionals at work in dealerships, independent shops, collision repair shops, auto parts stores, fleets, schools and colleges throughout the United States of America.

ASE currently offers over 50 industry-related, monitored, computer-based, voluntary tests at specific testing centers. If the technician passes an ASE test and meets the relevant work experience requirement, an ASE credential is awarded and displayed to peers and customers indicating expertise in that area of vehicle repair.

# Where You Come In

ASE and certain Australian automotive industry associations and organizations are exploring whether the ASE tests and credential process will fit in this market and benefit technicians and workshops.
