### South Australia

South Australia will move back to level 3 restrictions at 12:01am on Wednesday 28 July 2021. Automotive businesses will be open to the public with no restrictions of trade. However, they must follow the guidelines for density quotas and masks which include:

- 1/4 density (1 person per 4 square metres)
- Masks for high risk settings
- Masks for shared indoor public places

### Victoria

From 11.59pm tonight, Tuesday 27 July, lockdown will be lifted. Victorians will be able to leave their homes for any reason, and there will no longer be an Authorised Worker List. This means vehicle mechanical service and repair will be able to accept any and all customers, and retail can open in line with density limits of 1 person per 4 square metres.

Masks will continue to be required everywhere indoors and outdoors (except private residences), unless an exception applies.

### New South Wales

Blayney, Cabonne and Orange local government areas in the central west of the state will have lockdown lifted at 12.01am Wednesday 28 July. Businesses in these areas will be required to follow the regional NSW restrictions ongoing. You may have the greater of 25 people, or one person per 4 square metres. You must also wear a fitted face mask when you are in an indoor area of a non-residential premises across NSW.
