Don't exceed density quotient. Covid Check-in Marshall at each entrance. Changes that will occur from <u>6pm Friday 29 October</u> .		
	Note – obligation on employer to comply i.e. notify workers, not permit worker onsite unless they are vaccinated in accordance with direction or have exemption, sight and record vaccination status information. However, worker must not supply false or		
	misleading information.
